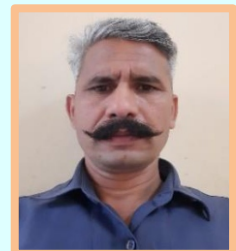

HISTORICAL RECORD

01 APR 2021 TO 30 JUN 2022

Another unusual and challenging year passed by for the AFPI. The Covid scare continued through the beginning of the year which forced us to shut down the institute and resort to on-line mode of teaching and training; something that we had tried out last year too. This time, however, we had learnt from our last years' experience and made some innovative changes in the way we trained. Carrying out PT on-line in the morning was one such innovation as well as some research work was assigned to the cadets to be submitted on line. We will soon graduate on to better systems and methods as being done in schools and institutions should the need arise in future. SOPs for the same are being worked out.

10th course training began online on 07 Jul 21. We expected them to join us on 08 Aug 21 but the restrictions kept getting extended and nothing much could be done about the same. The 11th course also joined the Institute virtually and waited patiently for news to get better. They finally joined the Institute physically in September.

Shemrock school did remarkably well in continuing with on-line training and the feedback system improved during the session this year. We could identify the cadets who were not taking adequate interest as also plan for extra classes on line for the weak cadets. All in all, the school was able to finish the syllabus as per plan and hand over the cadets to us for the UPSC exam training. These too continued on line and luckily for us, there were no problems faced during this phase.

138 Course at NDA passed out on 12 Jun 21. A total of 12 Cadets of our institute successfully passed out and proceeded to their respective finishing academies.

Passing out parade was held at the IMA on 12 Jun 21. 12 Cadets of our institute were awarded their commission. The ex-cadets who did us proud are:-

- (a) ACALoveneet Singh
- (b) BUO Rajdeep Singh
- (c) Arunav Laroiya

ACA Loveneet Singh stood third in the order of merit and bagged the bronze medal. Unfortunately, parents were not allowed to witness the parade due to covid restrictions.

The Naval academy held its passing out parade on 19 Jun 21. The following ex-AFPIANs passed out:-

- (a) Sehaj Sharma
- (b) Preetinderpal Singh

The IAF combined graduation parade was held at Air Force Academy on the 18 Jun 22. We had two AFPIAN's earning their wings at the glittering ceremony. Of these, Ex-Cadets, Fg Offr Raghav Arora bagged the 'Sword of Honour' and Fg Offr Shubhdeep Singh Aulakh stood 2nd in Order of Merit, bagging the trophies for 'Best in Flying' and 'Most Accomplished Cadet' of his flying course.

A large number of newspapers carried photos of our cadets who did themselves and their parents proud. AFPI wishes all the newly commissioned officers a very bright and happy future in our Armed Forces. We also look forward to getting them over to the institute in the near future.

Regular guest lectures continued for the cadets during the year. 6 Cadets were taken to the British Consulate for a high tea to celebrate World Armistice Day. Our cadets also were invited to give a lecture on the Battle of Basantar at YPS Patiala where a seminar on the 1971 operations was organised to commemorate the 50th year of the war. Our cadets did a very fine job of the presentation and received kudos from all for the same. After the seminar, they visited the local army formation for a familiarisation visit.

CBSE results for the 10th course were declared on 22 Jul. The students of the course did exceedingly well in the exams conducted. Of the 50 cadets who appeared, 09 scored above 85% marks. The Principal tells us that this is the best result so far from the boys of Shemrock.

The delayed CBSE exams and the delay in the UPSC exam gave our boys more time to study. 50 boys appeared for the said exam held for the 149th course NDA on 14 Nov 2021. Results were announced on 15 Dec 2021. 31 boys cleared the exam which is good going. The hard work put in by the boys coupled with efforts of the IMPACT trainers have yielded good results. The boys hardly got enough time after their NDA exam prepare for their board exams which commenced after 10 days.

In the absence of a dedicated GTO, the institute resorted to outsourcing the services of a few. We also hired Interviewing officers for the boys to get used to the interviewing technique. All in all, the boys were well prepared for the SSB's which began in Jan-Feb 2022. Of the boys who appeared, 10 boys cleared the SSB which is a good result by all standards. In addition, 02 boys of the senior courses also appeared for SSB of which 12 cleared. Almost all boys have cleared their medicals; some after some hiccups though!

The merit list for the NDA was published on 14 Jun 2022. The highest rank was achieved by Cadet Tanmay Sharma, who scored an All-India merit of 21. All boys have merit below 350 and therefore, will be joining the NDA when the course commences in July/Aug 2022 subject to their medical fitness. The institute wishes all those joining the 149th course the very best and we are sure that all will do well and achieve laurels in future too.

We received news from ex cadet Mukesh of 3rd course that he had received call letter to join the OTA (SSC-113 course). Additionally, Cdt Jaskaran of 8th course received a call letter for TES 45 with an AIR 58. Gaurav Saini of 5th course also joined the IMA on Jan 2022.

The founding father of the Institute, Gen BS Grewal finally said goodbye to the institute on the 18th of October. The General has put in exactly 11 years of service towards making the AFPI what it is today. Despite the covid restrictions, he was given a fond farewell by us and we were privileged to hear an inspirational speech by him which further motivated all towards working towards excellence. AFPI wishes Gen Grewal a very happy and contented life at Patiala where he settles down after an excellent innings.

Teams from the Govt's of Haryana, Himachal and UP visited the institute to understand our way of working. It seems that our successful model is going to be copied by other states of our country soon!


The passing out function for the cadets of the 10th course was held immediately after the cessation of their board exams. We at the AFPI wish them well in all their endeavours and hope that they keep the flag of institute flying sky high wherever they go and in whatever they do.

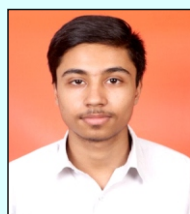
EVERYDAY...

It is clearly visible who will get profits and who will get loots...

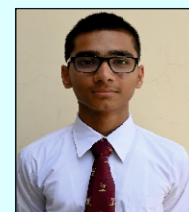

HOSTEL MEMORIES

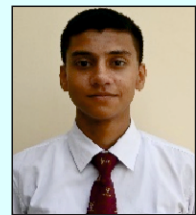

There are many lessons to be learnt from this visit.

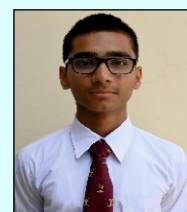
